Hello and welcome to the first Yaxlev Runners newsletter of 2012

First of all, let me start by thanking each and every person who helped ensure that the Folksworth 15 was a fantastic success once again on Sunday.

As ever, the race was a complete sellout, and, in fact, was full well before Christmas. And the comments on the Runners World website were full of praise, with many of those taking part particularly pleased with the excellent organisation and how helpful everyone was.

Amazingly, despite the extremely windy conditions,

the course record was broken, with Aaron Scott of Nene Valley Harriers finishing more than two minutes ahead of his nearest competitor in 1:19:07

Spencer Evans was the first Yaxley member home in 1:37:41 to finish a fantastic 29th, with Simon Hunt, Hugh Burton, Ian Vallance, Steve Joy, Duncan Jackson, Neil Bason, Gary Masters, Carl Moss, Nikki Timms, Matt Bone, Rob Coles, Stuart Reed, Julie Howe and Barbara Johnson also competing.

So, thank you, once again. The race is vital in ensuring that the club remains financially sound, and there's no

way we could do it without all of your help.

Since the last issue, we have had three Frostbite races, with great turnouts of Yaxley members at each event.

We currently sit in 12th place in the league standings, although a top 10 place is not out of reach if we can do well at the final two races, which take place at Bourne Woods on Sunday, February 5, and in Huntingdon on March 4.

Please do try to turn up if you can, it's always great to see dozens of yellow and

green tops on display at these races, and the more runners we have in action,

the more chance we have of moving up that league table.

In the midweek Harrier League events, our members are certainly doing the club proud, with four of the top six positions being occupied by Yaxley runners.

Nikki Timms currently sits in second, with Al Good, Neil Bason and Ian Vallance hot in pursuit.

The next Harrier League race takes place on Wednesday, February 1. The 5k race is run in a handicap format, and the action starts at 7pm. Meet in the car park next to O'Brien's, in Lynch Wood, from 6.30pm. Entry costs just £1.

Away from the Frostbite and Harrier Leagues, members have been involved in a variety of other races.

In November, four runners competed in the Rutland Marathon, with Matt Lauch leading the team home in 3:19:17. Kyle Ballantyne clocked 4:01:44 in his first 26.2-miler, while John Ackroyd completed the course

in 4:10:49 and Gary Masters finished in 4:30:08.

Mr Lauch was again the first Yaxley member home at the St Neots Half Marathon just a fortnight later in 1:24:50.

Among the highlights of the other performances was Barbara Johnson, who attained a platinum standard by finishing in 1:53:39.

A week later saw one of the highlights of the club's running year - the Hereward Relay.

Last year we had eight teams taking part in the race between Peterborough and Ely. And it saw one of the best ever performances from a Yaxley team, with the Hampton Hares (Andy Head, Hugh Burton, Simon Hunt and Ian Vallance) finishing in a superb 35th place.

A big well done to all the other teams - The Anti-Razor League, Timbo and the Jets, Three Plus One, The Eight Minute Men, Girls on the Run. Three Roosters and a Chick, and Run DMC - who

all ensured the event was as eniovable as ever.

The final big race of the vear was the Nene Vallev 10. in Bretton.

Once again, we had another fine turnout of members. with Simon Hunt first home in 1:01:33. The first lady home was Claire Piercy in 1:14:35.

Away from running, the club held its Christmas party at Peterborough Rugby Club in December.

The club's next social event is a night at Peterborough Greyhounds on Friday, February 17.

The club has a private suite booked for the night, with food provided. There will also be dedicated bar and betting facilities. It should be a great night, and a bargain at just £15. Places are limited to 40 people, so put your name down on the list in the changing room or contact Peter Thompson as soon as possible if you want to attend.

Finally, I am sure you will all join me in congratulating members Tracy and Gavin Farrow on the birth of their second son Cavden, pictured above, who was (eventually!) born earlier this month.
